

ST. JOHN VIANNEY  
PARISH COUNCIL MEETING  
MAY 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2003

Fr. Pat opened the meeting with a prayer.

Those attending were Fr. Pat, Tim VanRoy, Mary Lou Dietsch, Pat Mategrano, Bob Drewes, Kelly Korth, Pat Riedmann, Marilyn Olson, John Wardian, and Deb Ash. Val Shovanec was excused.

Updates on the various committees are as follows:

**Social Hall Regulations.**

There was a discussion about opening the hall to other parties of people besides parishioners and their families. A suggestion was made that we should make it available only for parishioners at first. Then as the need arises, open it up to the general community. This will be brought up for discussion again at our next meeting.

It was proposed that the committee that worked up the regulations for use of the social hall continue on as an advisory board. Current committee members are: Pat Mategrano, Dave Grossman, Cece Grossman and Brian Corey. Pat suggested adding other members and invited Tim VanRoy, who accepted.

The rules for the use of the hall will be included in the next issue of the Vianney Vine.

The old social hall will not be available after May 27<sup>th</sup>. The tables will have to be stored during the construction period and then will be put to use in the classrooms

**Social Hall Furniture.**

Chairs for the social hall have been bought and are being stored. Sixty tables have been special ordered and will arrive soon. Cloth table cloths have been purchased.

**Office Furniture**

Deb Ash stated that she's been looking for used office furniture opportunities. Fr. Pat suggested that most of the existing furniture could be used, but once they move into the new work space, new needs may have to be addressed.

**Pews, Chapel and Altar Furniture**

The committee that is working on purchasing the items for the worship space met recently with representatives from ZBM. The committee members present reported on the current status of these items. Further meetings with ZBM will give us a better idea of their cost and affordability.

A group will visit the Lambrecht Glass Studio to see examples of stained glass.

**Marble.**

Marilyn Olson reported on the status of the marble. A decision needs to be made of which pieces will work in the new chapel. Any unused pieces may be donated to the archdiocese for display in the archdiocese museum. Deb Ash suggested that we contact The Cleaning Mart, 8415 West Center Rd. She believes they sell a cleaning solution and preservative that is used on marble. Marilyn will check it out.

**Social.**

The party dubbed as "The Last Supper" will be held on Saturday, May 24<sup>th</sup>. Chaired by Pat Geary, it will be the last social function in the old social hall. Dinner and refreshments will be provided. The parish has

hired a singer to perform during early part of the evening. Following , a video and people's stories of the parish are planned T-shirts that say "I was at the Last Supper" will be available for purchase.

### **Marketing Committee.**

Pat Riedmann reported on the progress of this committee. According to her, Pat Roth has volunteered to work on the committee. Currently, they are working on a dedication book to be available on the completion of our renovation project. Both Pat Riedmann and Pat Roth will work to sell advertising space and John Wardian will work on the design.

Other business:

On a recent trip to Rome, Fr. Pat purchased art prints that have been framed and will be displayed. There will be an opportunity for parishioners to own the art, although it will have to be left on display in various areas of the church.

Tim reported that he and Mary Lou Dietsch had met earlier to discuss the length of terms for the current council members. Marilyn Olson's term should have ended this year, but in an effort to maintain continuity, she agreed to extend for another year. The rest will be returning for the second year of a three term.
